The theme of this year's March is "Abortion isn't Healthcare."

Around 90% of abortions are through pills and studies have shown as many as 1 in 17 women using these abortion pills end up in hospital due to complications. We will send you an application form which will need to be completed and returned to the parish office with a **copy of your child's Catholic Baptism Certificate**. If your child was baptised in the parish at either St Thomas Aquinas or All Saints Church, we will already have your child's Baptism Certificate.

If your child will be in year 3 at St Thomas Aquinas School or in year 3-6 at Bishop Parker School, there is a separate programme, and you do not need to enrol in this Parish Course.

Children in school years 3 and 4 will join the Wednesday session 6:00pm – 7:00pm (Group One) children in years 5, 6, & 7+ will join the Saturday session 4:00pm-5:15pm (Group 2). The course will begin on Wednesday, 11th September and Saturday, 14th September 2024 respectively and will take place every Saturday / Wednesday thereafter in St Thomas Aquinas Church Meeting Room (MK2 2JE). Weekly participation at the Sunday Mass and full course attendance is essential to complete the Programme. There will be an Introductory Meeting for Parents at 5:30pm on Friday, 6th September at St Thomas Aquinas Church (MK2 2JE). The course also includes preparation for the Sacrament of First Confession. Further details will be sent with enrolment forms on application to the Parish Office.

Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima

On 14th/15th September the World Apostolate of Fatima-England and Wales is bringing to our parish the Centenary Pilgrim Virgin Statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (CPVSIHM), as approved by Bishop David Oakley. This beautiful statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was blessed at the Chapel of the Apparitions at Fatima, Portugal in 2018 to prepare the faithful for the Centenary of the Pontevedra apparition. On 10th December 1925, Our Lord and Our Lady requested the communion of Reparation on the Five First Saturdays.

Pope St John Paul II said the Fatima message "is the true Gospel of Christ presented anew to our generation... Let us receive the light that comes from Fatima, let us be guided by Mary." All are invited and encouraged to come and see this beautiful CPVSIHM with the Relics of Saints Jacinta and Francisco.
