Car Parking at All Saints

We received complaints both from parishioners and residents due to poor parking in the car park at All Saints Church at the 9am and 11am Masses. Please remember to fill up the bays **closest** to the Church first. By parking on the perimeter before other bays have been filled it prevents access to free bays. Please Park considerately and don't simply abandon a vehicle in a rush to get into Mass.

Please do not park in bays marked "Resident Only" or on the double yellow lines in Corfe Crescent.

The local authority has been informed about parking infringements and action will be taken in the way of fines etc if people park illegally.

If you need to drive away quickly after Mass, it is best to arrive early and park legally and considerately on the roads around the Church rather than using the car park which takes time to clear after Mass.

We will send you an application form which will need to be completed and returned to the parish office with a **copy of your child's Catholic Baptism Certificate**.

If your child was baptised in the parish at either St Thomas Aquinas or All Saints Church, we will already have your child's Baptismal Certificate.

If your child will be in year 3 at St Thomas Aquinas School or in year 3-6 at Bishop Parker School, there is a separate programme, and you do not need to enrol in this Parish Course.

Children in school years 3 and 4 will join the Wednesday session 5:45pm – 7:00pm (Group One) children in years 5, 6, & 7+ will join the Saturday session 4:00pm-5:15pm (Group 2). The course will begin on Wednesday, 16th September and Saturday, 19th September 2026 respectively and will take place every Saturday / Wednesday thereafter in St Thomas Aquinas Church Meeting Room (MK2 2JE).

Weekly participation at the Sunday Mass and full course attendance is essential to complete the Programme.

There will be an Introductory Meeting for Parents and children to attend. Dates will be notified on application. The course also includes preparation for the Sacrament of First Confession. Further details will be sent with enrolment forms on application to the Parish Office.

Urgent Action Required!

On Friday 11 September 2026, the Assisted Suicide Bill, which has been brought back to Parliament, will have its pivotal Second Reading vote in the House of Commons. Despite the Bill being shown to be irreparably flawed it is being brought back to Parliament again.

If the Bill passes at Second Reading, it would dominate not only the remainder of the parliamentary session but also the rest of the Parliament, given the implementation period would likely carry on until 2031. This Bill would put vulnerable people at risk, as outlined by groups representing vulnerable people and by numerous Royal Colleges, institutions that would be responsible for implementing the Bill.

Please take and complete a postcard and send it to our local MP, Callum Anderson, urging him to attend Parliament on the 11th September to vote against the Bill or alternatively send him an email online by going to www.righttolife.org.uk and then click on 'Support not Suicide' campaign and fill in your details.

This is a time when MPs need to come together to focus on the core issues facing our country. The last thing Britain needs now is for another divisive battle over a controversial issue that will distract from the public's priorities.

MPs should oppose this Bill and instead commit together to investing in better palliative, hospice and social care at the end of life.
